The Royal Navy will host a National Service of Thanksgiving to mark 50 years of the Continuous at Sea Deterrent (CASD) on 3rd of May. New CASD Dreadnought submarines are currently being constructed as part of a £205 billion Trident replacement scheme.

CND and Christian CND will hold protests, vigils and 'alternative service of Witness' at Westminster Abbey on the day of the service if this celebration of nuclear weapons goes ahead. Keep the day free – Friday 3rd May.
